


PALMER FAMILY HISTORY








SENATOR THOMAS PALMER

- -FIRST EUROPEAN OWNER
- -BUILT LOG CABIN IN THE MIDDLE OF THE SOUTH COURSE
- -MADE HIS FORTUNES IN LOGGING UP NORTH
- -LEFT HIS 80 ACRES TO HIS DAUGHTER MARY
- -US SENATOR 1883-1889
- -FOUNDER OF THE MICHIGAN
- HUMANE SOCIETY
- -CHAIRMEN HEAD OF THE FARMING COMMITTEE
- -SPONSORED THE BILL CREATING
- THE DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE
- -SPONSORED THE 19TH AMENDMENT AND THE RIGHT TO VOTE FOR ALL WOMEN
- -DONATES LAND AND \$15,000 FOR THE CONSTRUCTION OF THE DIA
- -PALMER LEARNED TO RIDE HIS BIKE IN RETIREMENT AND TRAVELLED TO AND FRO


-Designers of the Park include Fradrick Law Olmstead (Prospect Park and Central Park NYC) and Mason and Rice (Grand Hotel, Fisher Brothers' Mansions, and Masonic Temple)

- -After Palmer's death his house and orchards were demolished
- -The Apartment District was constructed with more architectural styles in it's time-than any other city in the world
- -The trolley lines ended and originated in the park bringing 15,000 people per day during the golden years

2010 Completed PH1 Palmer Park removing 'Milk Crate Village'


2010 Formally organised our non-prophit

2011-Today PH 2 Palmer Park improvement in-process with displacement through site-lines





EMERALD NECKLACE BIKE ROUTE






PARK FOCUS AREAS





Master Plan for the Emerald Necklace

- Creating a connected biking route that links parks, people, and places for communities to flourish
- Incorporate more 'mountain bike' texture in the riding route to take advantage of natural beauty

Master Plan for Palmer Park

- Restore the historical value of the park and make it accessible to horse back riding, biking, hiking, and people's connection to a virgin forest
- Focus on infrastructure issues with a long view

BIEDETHOIS NEXT STEPS PROJECT WARHORSE

SCOPE:

BUILD A HORSE BARN AND CORALE FOR THE DETROIT MOUNTED POLICE TO HAVE FREE RANGE SPACE AND CAPACITY TO DOUBLE THE FORCE

TIMING: 6 MONTHS

IMMEDIATE CLEAR AND REMOVAL OF INVASIVE SPECIES BEHING

EXISTING FACILITY. UTILIZE THE WOOD FOR BUILDING THE FENCING AND SUPPORTS FOR THE HORSE BARN.

COSTS:

- Clear/ Harvest/ Removals and Stump Grinding
- GRADE REPAIR
- BARN CONSTRUCTION
- UTILITIES
- SEPTIC FIELD
- PLANT PASTURE
- BUILD CORRAL

PROJECT PARJANA

SCOPE:


IMPLEMENT A WATER MANAGEMENT SYSTEM THAT PERMENATELY CORRECTS THE WATER GRADE AND ENTRAPEMENT IISSUES THAT AREA AFFECTING THE NATIVE VIRGIN FOREST

TIMING:

STARTING IN JUNE 2014 CONTRACT WITH THE PARJANA GROUP TO IMPLEMENT THEIR SYSTEM

COSTS:

- -SITE PREPERATION AND MANAGEMENT
- -PROCESS DEVELOPMENT AND INSTALLATION

BUILD A RESEARCH FARM FOR THE PUBLIC TO BENEFIT FROM HAVING ORGANIC PRODUCE WHILE REALIZING A SELF-SUSTAINABLE MODEL
